


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# FRIDAY - FIRST SESSION

#### Fran Liberatore - When learning is "invisible"

In this session we'll talk about what education and learning can mean when we begin to see children as whole, complex, capable people. We'll discuss all the various ways young people learn and how reducing learning to something concrete and measurable strips it of the many ways it can happen and look like. We'll also talk about why it even matters to recognise learning, by discussing invisible learning as a way to push back on dominant narratives around children, education and learning.



#### **Rosalia Rivera - Consent, Kids + Cultivating Safety**


Rosalia will present on the different aspects of body autonomy, boundaries, consent and this foundational education as the basis for raising empowered children that understand their rights, but also the rights of others, and how this can create the robust and more effective transition to body safety education as the child develops. Considering that we exist within an ever increasing rape-culture, this education has become more critical than ever to teach. But this education cannot happen without the understanding of our role as conscious parents and how that translates to our day to day interactions with our children. These are deeply embedded practices from previous parenting generations that need to be unlearned and innovated upon as a collective parent village, not only for our children's safety, but also their mental and physical well-being.

This requires cultivating and teaching critical thinking and challenging norms of figures of authority to truly cultivate a culture of consent and safety for current and future generations.

# **Leslie Priscilla - Reclaiming Sovereignty through Reparenting and Liberatory Parenting Practices**



Included will be an exploration of the practice of Reparenting Ourselves and how it applies to Self-Directed Education, with a focus on developing a relationship to our Inner Child, our Inner Parent, and our own Future Ancestor Self. We will cover what it could look like to heal our parental wounds that often keep us from becoming the fullest and most evolved version of ourselves. As we aim to deconstruct a world that hurts the most vulnerable, we will begin with deconstructing the messaging that continues to prevent us from growth and fulfillment. This will be a truly transformative experience that will leave participants feeling connected, expanded, and hopeful for the vision we are collectively working towards personally and collectively.


### Ms. Ashley



Regardless if you're a facilitator, running an ALC or a parent, if you're an adult supporting youth - this offering is for you!








# Gina Riley, Ph.D. - Intrinsic Motivation and Unschooling

This presentation explores the theories of Self-Determination, Cognitive Evaluation, and Intrinsic Motivation as it applies to unschooling and self directed learning. Because of curriculum and time constraints, intrinsic motivation may be difficult to facilitate within the traditional classroom. However, one of the most impressive strengths of unschooling is that the entire process revolves around a child or teen's intrinsic motivation to learn. Let's explore the power that intrinsically motivated, self directed learning provides.

Join us to chat about what SDE means to us in the context of caring for the youngest humans, and our collective struggles, questions, ideas, and successes as we raise our babies as free people.






# Meenadchi - Deepening Intuition for Decision Making



Join a group of flying squad youth and facilitators to discuss the ins and outs of Flying Squads. Bring your questions!







## Dominique Dje Dje





How to recognise and process the thoughts and behaviours in educators, parents, and students that can compromise the integrity of your SDE practice.




### Ieishah Clelland - Things I've learned in 2 Years of Worldschooling

A workshop on the role storytelling can play in self-directed education and how we can support ourselves and others in creating and collaborating.









# Brooklyn Wetzel - Pop Culture Positive: A human centered and positive approach to screen time

After having led many discussions on screen time, Brooklyn brings a different angle to this year's

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
SDE weekend, with a focus on the quality and values pop culture and screens bring to our lives. The idea of youth accessing popular media can be scary. Brooklyn shares her family's philosophy as cultural "omnivores", and how those scary places are exactly the nooks and crannies of humanity we need to educate and inform youth about. Brooklyn will share the details and values of their human centered and positive experiences integrating popular media like movies, TV shows, Video games and Youtube content as an important part of their "unschooled" educational experience. We will dive into the privilege of access to media and the privilege of protection from uncomfortable content. How the media shapes our views of other cultures and realities, and how we can support discernment and anti-racism through media exploration.

Moving past the conventional; discussion of managing your youths' time on screens, Brooklyn will explore how opening up to popular media brings a deeper world view for the whole family. How dissolving value judgments brings trust to our relationships with our youth and how to build media literacy and online safely into your family culture.

# Zoe - How to be an SDE kid in a schoolish world

In this panel, Unschoolers will discuss their experiences and thoughts on growing up in a world that is often doubting, questioning, mistrusting, and making fun of young people who aren't sitting in school all day. 
## **Crystal Byrd Farmer**
